## Are You Ready to Make a Difference?

Our Academic Blood Challenge (ABC) program educates high school students about the importance of donating blood to help save lives in our community, while offering them the opportunity to engage in community service and build class spirit.

#### Show me the Blood!

Community Blood Services depends upon the participation of area high schools like yours to ensure blood is available for patients in its community hospitals! First-time donors from high school blood drives help build a new generation of young, dedicated volunteer donors. Our ABC Scholarship Program recognizes schools that partner with us to run drives by offering scholarships based on the success of their drives. Here's how your school can host a successful blood drive:

#### Schedule an Educational Presentation

with an ABC team member who will come speak to your junior and/or senior class about the blood donation process and how to run a successful blood drive. Team members include our medical coordinator and clinical services manager.

#### **Build a Super Committee**

of government leaders, faculty members, and club representatives to recruit donors within your school and community and publicize the upcoming drive.

#### Generate Publicity and Create Excitement

about the upcoming drive by running announcements in school and community newspapers and through your PA system.

#### Recruit Donors for Automated Donations.

a simple process that allows donors to give two units of red blood cells to help more patients and decreases the likelihood of patients having post-transfusion reactions.

#### Follow-Up Your Successful Drive

by including information and photos about the drive in your yearbook, on Facebook and Twitter, your school's website, and in your local newspaper as a reminder of its success and to generate additional drives at your school.
